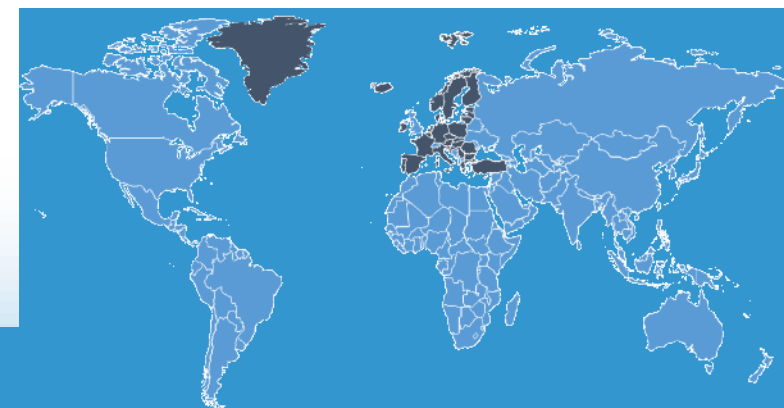

For Whom ? HEI learners and staff

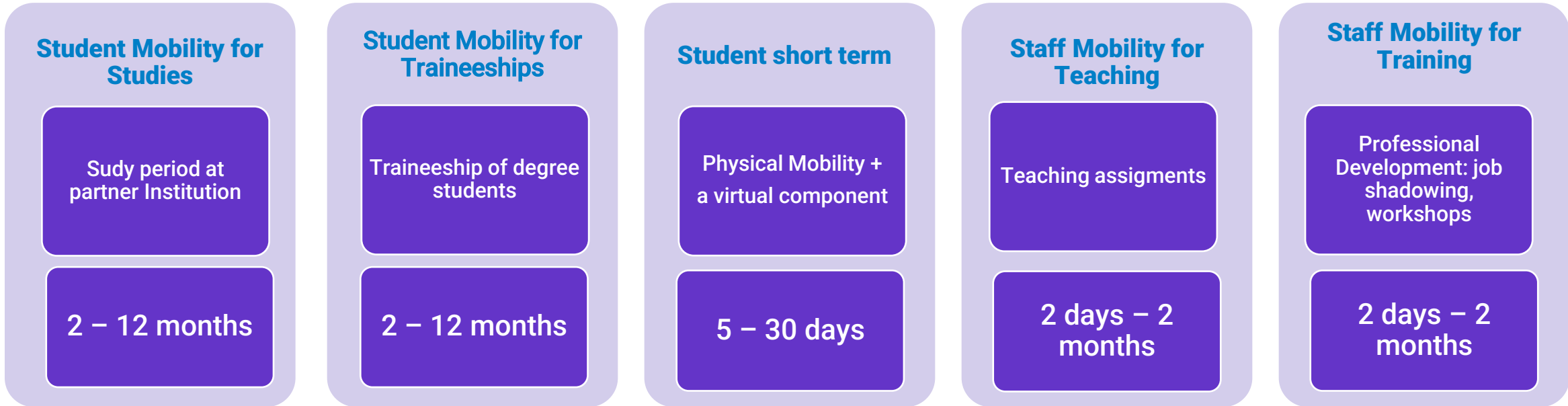
To do what ? mobilities:

- study period, placement, (or combine both) for students
- Training, teaching (or combine) both for staff
- Blended Intensive Programme for all participants
- Invited staff from public or private organisation (not awarded with an ECHE)

To go where ? 33 programme country or rest of the world (20%)

Mobility types in KA131

All mobility can be of a blended type



PhD Students:

Can benefit from Student Mobilité Schemes (no need of virtual component for short term)
Depending on their status can also benefit from Staff Mobility

BIP : Blended Intensive Programme

Develop innovative, cross-curricular teaching practices combining online cooperative activities with group mobility

PARTICIPANTS

- Open to ALL : students & staff (teaching, administrative, technical)
- Minimum 10 mobile learners (from a programme country ; funded by KA131)

PROGRAMME

- 1 physical mobility period: **from 5 to 30 days**
- **Virtual** component
- Delivery of at least **3 ECTS** (for students)

PARTNERSHIP

- At least **3 HEI** from 3 programme countries (Inter-institutional agreement is required)
- Possibility to associate third countries not associated to the programme

IMPACT

- Added-value to the training programme
- Contribution to the development of collaborative skills

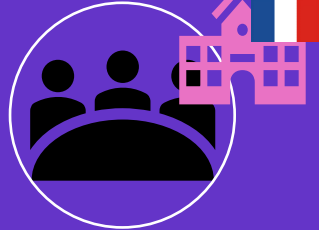

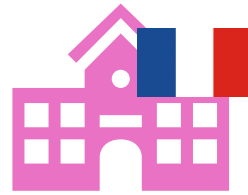

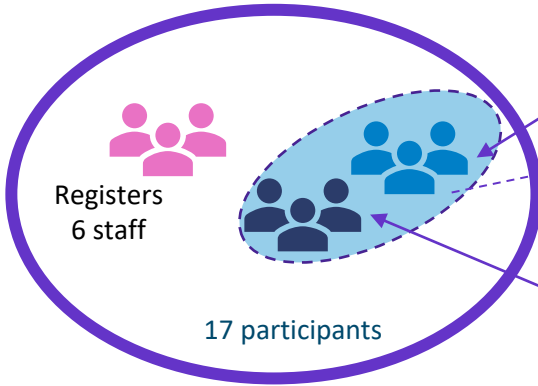

- Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Republic of North Macedonia, Serbia and Turkey (= third countries associated to the Programme)

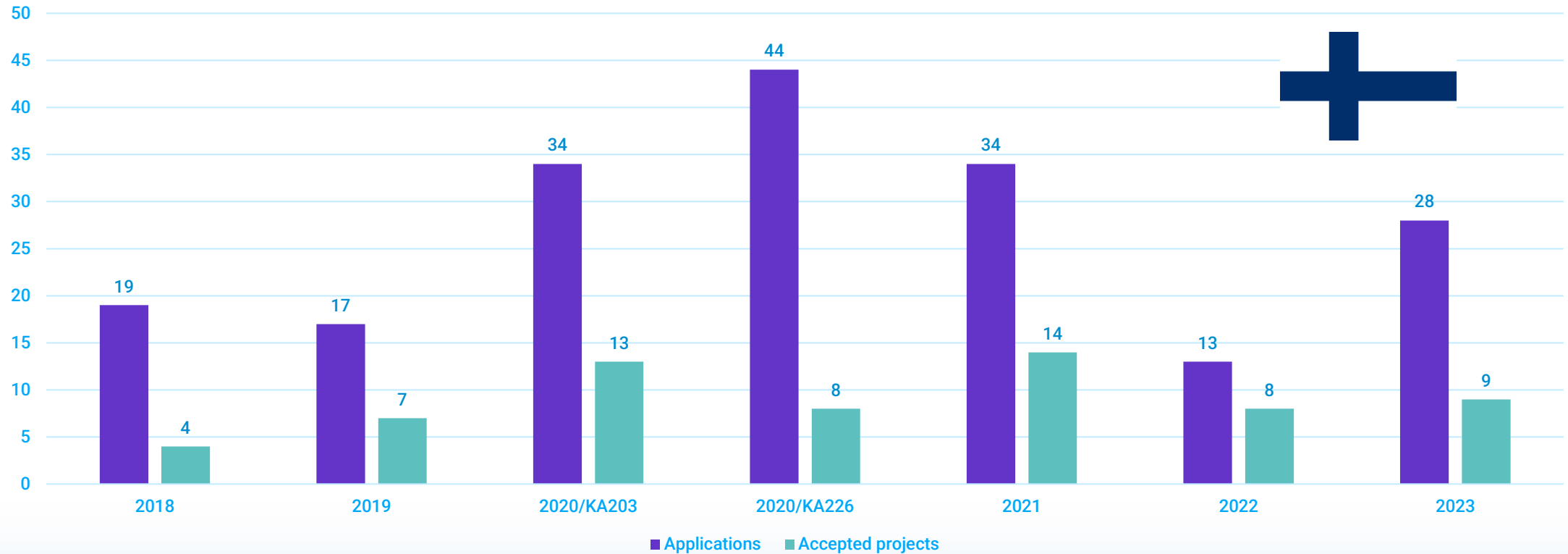
Third countries NOT associated to the Programme: Added value!

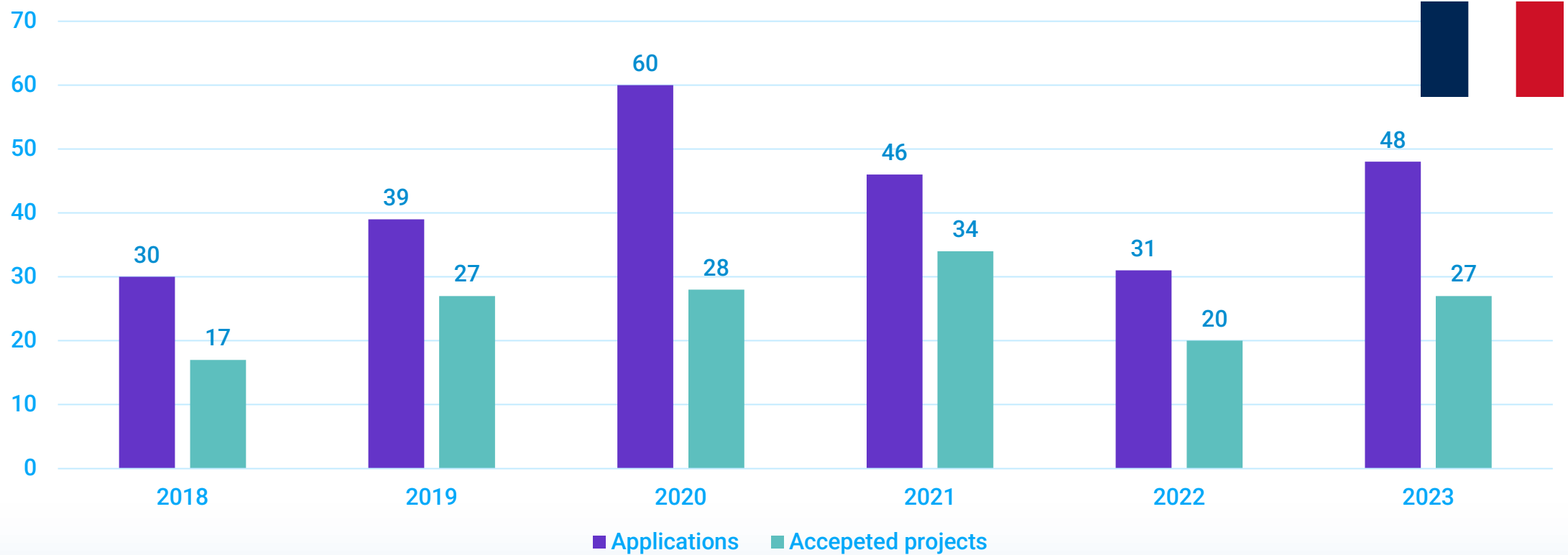

Project example - Inclusive Digital Learning – Dig-2-Inc

- Finnish project coordinator: Turun yliopisto
- French partner: Université Dijon Bourgogne
- Inclusive Digital Learning (Dig-2-Inc) is an Erasmus+ project that offers training and design principles to staff members to facilitate inclusion of low-SES students. With a novel method of community reporting, we engage teachers and students to voice out experiences of diversity and support a culture of active engagement, equality and non-discrimination.
- As feelings of confidence and mastery are important for development of self-directed learning, we develop an ecosystem of micro-credentials and open badges to credential students' acquisition of academic skills in second and third cycle education. These equip disadvantaged learners to excel in life and digital skills, which is a necessary condition in achieving an equal standing with the more advantaged students.
- In addition to developing cognitive and learning-to-learn skills, project partners strengthen social partnerships to support attention to needs of low-SES students, and to extend the use of purposeful pedagogic strategies for inclusion to secondary schools, which prepare learners for higher education.

Transnational alliances of higher education institutions, paving the way towards the universities of the future.

- European Universities alliances are a flagship initiative of the European strategy for universities. They:
 - promote European values and identity by increasing European cooperation of a new generation
 - significantly improve the quality, performance, attractiveness and international competitiveness of European higher education and to enable in-depth institutional change in participating higher education institutions.
- expand to 60 EUA's involving more than 500 higher education institutions by mid-2024.
- 5 applications rounds, after 4 rounds 50 EUA's

European Universities

- Members from member States, third countries associated to the programme or Western Balkans. Geographical balance is one of the criteria for evaluating applications
- EUA alliances have on average 9 members
- Building blocks of EUA's
 - Long-term joint strategies
 - European inter-university campuses
 - Knowledge-creating teams
- Related application rounds in Horizon Europe –programme 2020 and 2023 KA3 Erasmus+ European Universities for legal status and joint European Degree label

Erasmus Mundus action

Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters (EMJM)

- EMJM programmes are jointly planned, have an integrated curriculum, and the programmes is implemented jointly
- The maximum financial support awarded to a programme is approximately just under EUR 5 million and for 4 years
- Include studies in at least two countries, and scholarships are available for those who study in them.
- EMJM consortium consists of at least three higher education institutions. The HEI's must be from three different countries and two of them EU member states or third countries associated to the Programme)



Erasmus Mundus Design Measures

- EMDM are targeted for HEI's that are interested in delivering a Joint Master programme but are not yet ready to launch it
- The funding will be awarded for a fixed period of 15 months and the amount is EUR 60,000
