Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF) - overview

A mono-beneficiary action to support postdoctoral research and careers

Main objectives

- Enhance the creative and innovative potential
- Foster excellence
- Support intersectoral, international and interdisciplinary mobility (the 3 l's)
- Provide opportunities to acquire and transfer new knowledge
- Bridge and encourage exposure to the non-academic sector contributing to long-term career sustainability
- Increase in high impact R&I output and greater contribution to the knowledge-based economy and society

Research areas

- All scientific fields
- Including Euratom areas (indicative amount EUR 1 million annually) within existing scientific panels






MSCA European Postdoctoral Fellowships

- Researchers of any nationality move to a host institution in an EU member state or Horizon Europe Associated Country
- Duration 12-24 months
 - + additional period of up to 6 months at a non-academic institution if interested (called a 'non-academic placement')
- Grant covers all costs related to the fellowhip
 - Researcher's salary
 - Costs for reseach, training and career developments
 - Costs for the host institution

Who can apply - eligibility

Nationality	Any
Doctorate	Must be in possession of a doctorate degree at the date of the call deadline. A doctorate degree is defined as a successful PhD defense
Mobility	The researcher cannot have resided or carried out his/her main activity (work, studies, etc.) in the country of the beneficiary (European Fellowship) for more than 12 months in the 36 months immediately before the fellowship
Research experience (full-time equivalent)	Maximum of 8 years full-time equivalent (FTE) experience in research, measured from the date of award of the first doctoral degree (can be extended due to e.g. maternity/Paternity leave, compulsory national service, research career breaks Self-assessment tool for calculating eligibility: rea.ec.europa.eu.xlsx (live.com)

Award criteria

Excellence	Impact	Quality and efficiency of the implementation
Quality and pertinence of the project's research and innovation objectives (and the extent to which they are ambitious, and go beyond the state of the art)	Credibility of the measures to enhance the career perspectives and employability of the researcher and contribution to his/her skills development	Quality and effectiveness of the work plan, assessment of risks and appropriateness of the effort assigned to work packages
Soundness of the proposed methodology (including interdisciplinary approaches, consideration of the gender dimension and other diversity aspects if relevant for the research project, and the quality of open science practices)	Suitability and quality of the measures to maximise expected outcomes and impacts , as set out in the dissemination and exploitation plan, including communication activities	Quality and capacity of the host institutions and participating organisations, including hosting arrangements
Quality of the supervision, training and of the two- way transfer of knowledge between the researcher and the host	The magnitude and importance of the project's contribution to the expected scientific, societal and economic impacts	
Quality and appropriateness of the researcher's professional experience, competences and skills

Ranking

- Proposals are ranked and funding is allocated **by scientific panel** (separate ranking for European and Global fellowships)
- **Seal of Excellence** awarded to proposals that receive a rank of $\geq 85\%$
- Resubmission restriction for same researcher and same host institution if score of
 <70% in previous evaluation

Indicative timeline & budget

- 10 April 2024: Launch of the call for proposals.
- 11 September 2024: Deadline for submitting proposals.
- February 2025: Notification of call results to applicants (TBC)
- April 2025: Grant agreement signature for successful projects (TBC) April 2025
- First EU-funded projects start (TBC)
- Indicative budget: EUR 417.18 million

I have identified a possible host – what now?

Contact them

- Send a short e-mail explaining who you are, your motivations and why you want to work with them and why this institution
- Specify that you want to apply with them to the MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships (include a link to the call page)
- Attach your CV and a short summary of your project (one-page-proposal)
- Make sure you are clear in what you are asking from them

Make sure you are visible

- Make sure your research pages/web site are upto-date
 - ✓ What you have done current CV
 - ✓ Include all activities : demonstrate that you are the right candidate for a Postdoctoral Fellowship
 - ✓ Research interests what you would like to work on in the future
- Social media personal vs professional



Postdoctoral Fellowships: a tool for international cooperation

Are you a Host Institution (university, research center)?

- Develop your existing scientific partnerships or create new ones through :
 - ✓ Hosting a research fellow from a partner lab in your lab (1-2 years)
 - ✓ Sending a postdoc from your team to a partner lab (1-2 years)

How to attract postdoctoral candidates

- Use your your professional networks
- Ask the French Embassy for support
- If relevant, make use of short mobility to identify candidates and discuss with them their projects
- Register your Hosting offers on Euraxess: https://euraxess.ec.europa.eu/jobs
- Make sure your research pages/web sites are visible and up-to-date
- Get informed about support to applicants provided by your institution (EU Grants office) and your National Contact Point and inform your candidates of it
- Prepare the PF applications <u>with</u> your postdoctoral candidate(s)

Only one proposal may be submitted by postdoctoral candidate per call.

Several proposals may be submitted by the same supervisor or Host Institution.
